Theatre/Drama

Students will explore, depict and celebrate human experience by imagining and representing people through live enactment. They will see drama as a collaborative art, combining physical, verbal, visual and aural dimensions and experience theatre by developing an understanding of the performer/audience relationship.



Music

Students will use the concepts and materials of music to compose, improvise, arrange, perform, conduct and respond to their own and others' work. They will learn the elements of music including duration (rhythm and tempo), dynamics, form, pitch (melody and harmony), and timbre (sound texture and quality) and be able to apply this knowledge to the voice, body, instruments, found sound sources (natural and manufactured objects including stones, household objects and so on) and information and communication technology.
