At Ekya Schools, Visual Art is a dynamic and interconnected journey. The Visual Art program fosters an appreciation and understanding of the arts, allowing students to build their knowledge and skills at each level. Learners develop their creative expression through hands-on learning experiences, encouraging them to explore, experiment, and collaborate.

The Visual Arts Program equips learners to:

- Express themselves in a creative manner, communicating through art forms such as dance, music and visual arts.
- Explore a variety of cultures and appreciate the various forms of artistic expressions of people around the world.
- Make connections between the arts and other disciplines.



Through the Visual Arts Program, students are taught to learn through making, developing skills in collaboration, managing complexity, and building curiosity and observation skills. They are encouraged to think through making mistakes and learning from them.

The core learning in the Visual Art program focuses on

- Representational skills
- Exploring wet and dry media
- Translating ideas into 2D and 3D works
- Going beyond the obvious using imagination.

Students also develop knowledge and understanding of visual art and design skills, learn terminology, and work with a given context. Collaborative work is encouraged, as is making without hesitation and allowing for failures.
