




CAMPUS HIGHLIGHTS


We look forward to seeing our students step away from the everyday, reconnect with themselves and each other, and return with stories, insights, and a renewed sense of purpose.







LEARNING & INSIGHTS

This approach ensures students develop essential skills while connecting historical and cultural knowledge to contemporary contexts.









Grade VI students engaged in a unique, authentic task inspired by the Mauryan Empire's Ashokan Edicts. As the "Head of School," students created modern edicts to promote discipline and responsible digital time usage at home and school. Through creative mediums like scrolls, chart papers, and visually engaging designs, students developed practical solutions on topics such as screen time limits, PE hours, and class schedules. This hands-on activity not only fostered creativity and collaboration but also encouraged critical thinking and the application of historical practices to modern challenges. A testament to Ekya's commitment to experiential learning.

As part of the Grade VII unit on the **Idea of Citizenship**, students engaged in a hands-on activity to explore civic responsibilities and community engagement. Through creative projects, they expressed their understanding of citizenship, focusing on concepts such as **rights**, **duties**, **and societal contributions**. This activity encouraged students to think critically about their role in society, fostering values of empathy, responsibility, and active participation. Ekya Schools' pedagogy continues to inspire students to connect classroom learning with real-world applications.





As part of the Grade VIII unit Italy: Birthplace of the Renaissance, students engaged in a collaborative group activity research and present significant developments of the Renaissance. Topics such as Galileo's contributions, the impact of the printing press, and the rivalry between Venice and Genoa were explored through descriptive posters and guided questions. This interactive approach encouraged teamwork, critical thinking, and a deeper understanding of the Renaissance's lasting influence on the world. Ekya's pedagogy seamlessly blends creativity with inquiry-based learning.

PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

The Professional Development team met the School Leadership teams, including Coordinators and Heads of Schools, for a one-day training program on 11 April 2025. We are happy to announce the commencement of our first cohort of the **Post-Graduate Diploma in Early Childhood Education**. LEADERSHIP CORNER



The phrase, "Education is the manifestation of perfection already in man," by Swami Vivekananda, beautifully captures our belief at Ekya—that education is about unlocking the potential already present within each learner. We are committed to helping our students discover their strengths and passions across academic and non-academic spheres.

Our initiatives around "student development" reflect our continued efforts in guiding students on their journey of self-discovery. We began the year with the student council elections, a significant event that familiarised students with the democratic process and prepared them for responsible citizenship. The nomination phase stood out, with candidates being interviewed by the school leadership team to evaluate their readiness. I was truly inspired by their clarity of thought, confidence, and vision. Following the nominations, candidates actively campaigned, blending their ideas with persuasive communication to gain their peers' trust and votes. This process nurtured growth, not only for the candidates as emerging leaders but also for the voters, who engaged thoughtfully and responsibly. Witnessing this transformation was deeply fulfilling, and I saw it as a small but meaningful step toward shaping future nation-builders.

We also introduced **Parivartan**, our **Service Learning Program** focused on encouraging sustainable practices. The aim was to foster change in everyday habits, particularly in the use of water, electricity, paper, and plastic. Students showed commendable commitment by segregating waste in classrooms and encouraging the same practice at home. We were especially proud of collecting 28 kg of e-waste for recycling. Being part of a community that genuinely cares about the environment is heartening and reinforces our collective commitment to social responsibility.

Alongside these real-world learning experiences, our academic programs are rooted in **application-based learning**. Discussions and assessments consistently connect to real-life contexts, ensuring that students understand the relevance of what they learn. We also hosted various competitions that emphasised skill-building and character development. While competitions often highlight winners and losers, we believe that each participant gains something valuable—be it in self-reflection, teamwork, goal-setting, or empathy. It's been gratifying to see students internalise these values and demonstrate them consistently in their co-curricular engagements.

Perhaps the most meaningful moments this year were the stories of individual growthstudents who questioned limiting beliefs. overcame emotional challenges, exceeded their and own expectations. As a school leader, these transformations fill me with pride. Watching our students peel back layers of self-doubt through reflection, practice, and courage reaffirms our purpose.

My vision for Ekya is to build a school culture where every student not only believes in their potential but also uplifts others in their journey as well—a community rooted in mutual growth and shared success.
